LOCAL RULES

1. OUT OF BOUNDS:

- Over any boundary wall or fence as defined by white stakes including the driving range fence.
- Beyond the line of white posts adjacent to the road to the right of the 16th fairway and behind 16th green

2. WATER HAZARDS:

Water Hazards (including Lateral Water Hazards) (Rule 26)

Water Hazards are defined by yellow stakes or yellow lines.

Lateral water hazards are defined by red stakes or red lines.

Note: Dropping Zones for Water Hazards:

Where there are dropping zones for water hazards, a ball may be played under Rule 26 or a ball may be dropped in the dropping zone nearest to where the original ball last crossed the margin of the hazard under penalty of one stroke.

For provisions relating to dropping or re-dropping a ball in a dropping zone, see the Note on pages 139-140 in the Rules of Golf.

- OBSTRUCTIONS:** Stones in bunkers, all seats and movable signs and bunker rakes are deemed movable obstructions.
- GROUND UNDER REPAIR:** If a player's ball comes to rest in an area of ground under repair (marked by a circular white line) from which play is prohibited, or if such an area of ground under repair interferes with the player's stance or the area of

intended swing, the player must take relief under rule 25-1(b), without penalty.

- BALL ON WRONG TEEING AREA:** A ball lying on a teeing area other than that of the tee being played is to be treated as Ground Under Repair and MUST be lifted off and dropped, without penalty, no nearer the hole.
- WALLS:** All walls including boundary, hedges, walls and the fence surrounding the driving range, are deemed to be integral parts of the course.
- DRAINAGE TRENCHES:** A ball lying on a gravel drain "through the green" shall be treated as Ground Under Repair.
- TREES:** If a player's ball lies within one club length of a staked tree or such staked tree interferes with the player's stance or the area of intended swing, the player MUST take relief under rule 24-2b(i), without penalty.
- IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS:** All tarmac and other made up paths, fixed sprinkler heads, stones indicating 150 yards from centre of green, are to be treated as immovable obstructions, relief as per rule 24-2. Any sign that cannot reasonably be moved may also be deemed an immovable obstruction.
